Report of Legal Aid Camp on 18.8.2018

That's why I left a job at a law firm for a career in public service, working to empower young people to volunteer in their communities. Because I believe that each of us — no matter what our age or background or walk of life — each of us has something to contribute to the life of this nation.—Michelle Obama

Legal Aid Clinics basically serve the purpose of providing legal advice not for the aim of earning profit but in General Public Interest. In law schools, though knowledge of law is thoroughly imparted. However theoretical knowledge is not sufficient when its applicability is not known. Opportunities for mooting are also limited. Students pursuing law have zeal and enthusiasm to provide legal services. Legal aid clinics thus serve the two-fold purpose, the first that they provide free legal services to economically weaker people and second, they direct the energies of the students of law in contributing to the society. These students are headed by their teachers. The members of the Legal Aid clinic are engaged in spreading legal awareness in rural areas through street plays as well as legal aid camps where they make the target population aware of different legal service programs and guide them to avail these facilities.

Article 14 of the Constitution of India talks about equality before law and Article 39A provides for equal justice and free legal aid.

"Article 39A of the Constitution of India provides for holistic approach in imparting justice to the litigating parties. It not only includes providing free legal aid via appointment of counsel for the litigants, but also includes ensuring that justice is not denied to litigating parties due to financial difficulties."

"The State, which has been mandated by Article 39A of the Constitution to ensure that the operation of the legal system promotes justice by providing free legal aid and that opportunities





for securing justice are not denied to any citizen by reason of economic or other disabilities, has not been able to create an effective mechanism for making justice accessible to the poor, downtrodden and disadvantaged. In last two and a half decades the institution of the legal services authorities has rendered yeoman's service in the field of providing legal aid to the poor but a lot is required to be done for ensuring justice to economically deprived section of the society and those who suffer from other disabilities like illiteracy and ignorance

Keeping in view of the above stated objectives IPEM Law Academy has organized Legal Aid Camp, Domestic Violence against Women at Sector -4 Raj Nagar, Ghaziabad on 18th August, **2018.** Faculty and students have participated in the legal aid camp by expressing their thoughts and views on the above-stated issues. The Camp was started with tribute to Late Atal Bihari Vajpayee (Former Prime Minister) by Ms. Sheela along with Faculty Members and Students for Five Minutes. The Introduction and importance of Legal Aid Camp was done by Dr. Meenakshi Tomar(Assistant Professor) which help to solve the problems of weaker sections of the society which are helpless in getting justice from the Courts, followed by Mr. Sudhakaran (Asst. Professor) who gave the throughout structure of the legal provisions in the Constitution and different Laws for the welfare and protection of Women Rights. 



FREE LEGAL AID CUM AWARENESS CAMP AT

ROZA JALALPUR ON 14TH OCTOBER, 2016

IPEM Law academy organized a Legal Aid cum Awareness Camp at Village Roza Jalalpur, Dist. Gautam Budh Nagar on 14th October, 2016. About 45 students of B.A. LL.B. VII and IX Semester students along with Members (Faculty), Dr. Meenakshi Tomar, Ms. Vandana Varshney and Mr. Padmesh Kataria participated in the camp.

The students gathered at the college at the college at around 9:30 AM and proceeded along with the Members-Faculty for the camp site by bus, arranged by the college itself. Upon reaching the camp village, the students and member coordinators were welcomed by the Village Pradhan and other villagers. The camp was attended by a gathering of sixty to seventy villagers in addition to the residents who were visited by the camp participants at three houses.

At the beginning, the Village Pradhan, Sh. Sukhbir Pradhan and the President of Zila Panchayat, Sh. Ravinder Bhati were felicitated with shawls presented by 'Dr. Meenakshi Tomar on behalf of IPEM Law Academy. The Village Pradhan, Sh. Sukhbir also addressed the gathering. Thereafter, Member-Faculty, Mr. Padmesh Kataria presented a talk on the 'Law relating to the Right to Information and its importance for the villagers', which was followed by a speech by Ms. Vandana Varshney, Member-Faculty that enlightened the villagers on the subject of 'Child Marriage and its ill effects'. Later, some student participants gave very informative speeches, notably among which was the very spirited speech by Ch. Babita Dagar, VII Sem student on the topic of 'Women Empowerment. Shashank from sem IX chose to speak on Public Interest Litigation, Rinku, also from sem IX, discussed some important provisions of the Constitution.

Thereafter, the Legal Aid Camp Members divided the students into three groups; i.e., each per faculty member and covered the whole village on foot and went door





to door meeting the villagers to make them aware of the IPEM's free legal aid service and enquired about any legal issues that they had. The villagers came up with various problems which related to government compensation related to land acquisition, property matters, pension claims, Insurance policies, lack of public utilities relating to sewerage and sanitation, administrative issues such as refusal by government authorities to give ration card, etc and even animal rights issues related to cows were raised by the villagers among others.

All the three groups gathered back at the camp site after about two hours and once again thanked the village pradhan for helping in organizing the camp by providing the space and for the gracious reception.




