





Object of the Moot Court

A moot court is an extracurricular activity at many law schools in which participants take part in simulated court proceedings, which usually involves drafting briefs (or memorials) and participating in oral argument. Students of Moot Court have spent many hours perfecting the legal analytical, research and writing skills that practicing attorneys must have. With Moot Court on one's resume, an employer knows that he/she has been learning to form and communicate legal arguments for a year or more; if he/she has already spent a lot of time in law school on these tasks, that's less time the firm will have to invest in his/her learning and more time one can spend practising law.





Even if one is not thinking of a job at a large firm, Moot Court can be quite useful as one will become increasingly more comfortable formulating arguments and expressing them in front of judges, essential skills for any attorney. If the students feel that their public speaking skills need some work, Moot Court is a great place to hone them.

On a more personal level, participating in Moot Court can also provide a unique bonding experience for a student and his/her team and give them a mini-support system during law school.




Report on Guest Lecture on ADR

STATE v. SIMARPREET

The Swaraj College of Education is a premier educational institution in North India. The college is celebrating its golden jubilee in 2011. This is a multi faculty institution with strength of 3000 students at its campus. There was great enthusiasm in the Students' Organizations to contest election in the golden jubilee year. The main contest was between Swaraj Student Organization (SSO) and Swaraj Democratic Organization (SDO). Both the groups tried hard to secure students' support and vote. Because of the close contest and high expectations of each group, great anxiety was looming large between the groups. Harpreet Singh was the candidate for the President ship from the SSO group. He was also having the support of a political party. Therefore, that Party's prestige was also involved in the success of this candidate. Harpreet spent a lot on throwing parties and also adopted other means and methods to garnish the support of the students. The candidate from SDO group Simarpreet was quite popular among the students for his honesty, integrity and always working for students' welfare. After a month long campaign the elections were held on 12 August 2011. Casting of vote went on peacefully. The result was declared on 13 August 2011 and Harpreet won the elections by a margin of just twelve votes. Wave of joy went around in the SSO Group and the SDO Group was disappointed and was sensing that victory of Harpreet was only due to money flow and unfair practices adopted by Harpreet.

On 16 August 2011, at about 7 PM at the College cafeteria Harpreet invited Simarpreet to his dinner party, the next day, with a view to normalize relations with Simarpreet. Simarpreet flatly refused the invitation by saying that he will

never attend a party hosted by a dishonest person. Mr. Harpreet insisted by explaining to him, "Let us forget our past animosities and work for the welfare of the students together." But Simarpreet again said "No! I do not wish to join your dinner party as I know how you have won the elections by fraudulent means. I will not go to the party of a scoundrel." At this Harpreet got annoyed felt insulted in the public. He told Simarpreet, "You know that I can adopt any means for what I want". Simarpreet left the cafeteria by saying, "Hell with you!". Simarpreet left the cafeteria and went away with his friend Khushpreet. At about 8.30 PM Khushpreet drove out in his Jeep from the parking area with Simarpreet seated in the jeep beside him. When their jeep was passing through the Main gate of the college, Harpreet and his friend Sameer were standing in wait for them. Now Harpreet was having pistol in his hand. Harpreet signaled Khushpreet to stop the Vehicle. But Simarpreet told him not to stop there. Then Harpreet fired in the air. Simarpreet asked Khushpreet to drive fast. Harpreet and Sameer chased the jeep on their bike with Sameer driving and Harpreet riding the pillion. Harpreet fired indiscriminately while chasing the jeep. One bullet hit Khushpreet in his right upper arm. Simarpreet asked Khushpreet to stop the vehicle and got down from the jeep. Sameer stopped the bike where Simarpreet was standing. Harpreet got off thebike tried to shoot at Simarpreet. But he could not as there was no cartridge in the pistol. Then Simarpreet took out an iron rod out of the jeep and aimed a hit at Harpreet. But Harpreet ducked and the rod fell on the head of Sameer who was sitting on his bike just next to Harpreet. Sameer started bleeding profusely and fell unconscious. Both Simarpreet and Khushpreet left the scene immediately. Harpreet took Sameer to hospital. Sameer died after 12 hours in the hospital. A case was registered against Simarpreet under section 302 read with Section 301 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860. Post mortem report disclosed the cause of death was head injury which was ante mortem in nature. Investigating officer recovered the iron rod



used by Simarpreet from a pond near Lower Road, upon information given by Simarpreet, while in police custody. Simarpreet pleaded right to private defence, grave and sudden provocation and accident. Argue Case on behalf of Prosecution and Defence before the Trial Court.










FACULTY MEMBERS WITH GRAM PRADHAN



MOOT COURT PROBLEM NO:3

AYESHA

.... APPELLANT

Vs

RIAZ

.... RESPONDENT

Facts of the case:

Mr.Riaz, aged 25 Years working as a clerk in a Commercial Bank at Tirupathi fell in love with Miss Iswarya, aged 22 years. They desired to marry. But the proposal of Marriage was not acceptable to the parents of Riaz, as the girl being Hindu. In order to solemnize the marriage with Riaz, Iswarya converted herself to Islam and changed her name as Ayesha. Their marriage was solemnized as per Muslim personal law on 2-1-2007.

However, after the marriage, Mr.Riaz began to ill-treat her demanding a huge amount of dowry from Ayesha's parents. Riaz's parents also joined hands with him to ill treat Ayesha finally, Mr.Riaz on 1-8-2007 left Ayesha at her parents home for want of dowry, knowing pretty well that she is pregnant.

On 15-2-2008, Smt Ayesha gave birth to a female child at her home. The birth of child was communicated to Mr.Riaz. But Mr.Riaz refused to receive the child and Ayesha as his desire for dowry has not been satisfied by her parents owing to their poor financial position.

Smt.Ayesha filed a petition for maintenance to herself and to her child under section 125 Cr.P.C in Tirupathi Family Court on 25-12-2009. She claimed maintenance of Rs.15,000/- per month as her husband Mr.Riaz is earning salary of Rs.30,060/- per month.

The respondent Mr.Riaz denied all the allegations and asserted that she has been living with her parents on her own free will and thus deserted him since 1-8-2007.

While the maintenance petition was pending before the Family Court, Mr.Riaz pronounced irrevocable Talaq on 2-3-2010 to dissolve his marriage with Ayesha.

Mr.Riaz contended that under the provisions of the Muslim Women (Protection of Rights on Divorce) Act, 1986, he is no more liable to pay any maintenance to Avesha and her child after Talaq.

However, the Family Court, Tirupathi directed the respondent Mr.Riaz to pay, Rs.9,000/- per month to wards, maintenance to Ayesha and her child from the date of petition, till the completion of "Iddat Period".

Smt. Ayesha, aggrieved by the decision of the Family Court, preferred an appeal to the High Court of Andhra Pradesh claiming maintenance beyond "Iddat Period".

The High Court of Andhra Pradesh also confirmed the decision of the Family Court. Therefore Smt. Ayesha preferred an appeal to the Supreme Court with special leave of the Apex Court, challenging the decision of the High Court of Andhra Pradesh.

MOOT COURT PROBLEM:

LL.B. III YEAR

SYNOPSIS OF FACTS

- 1. Shri Sudhir Gupta, the deceased, was the owner of one residential house, three commercial complexes and a cinema house having acquired the same under the registered partition deed dated 29.3.1967. He died on 31.12.1984 intestate. He left behind his legal heirs i.e. his wife Smt. Meenal Gupta, two married daughters Swati Goyal and Swapnil Gupta and two sons Shri. Subodh Gupta and Shri. Shreyans Gupta. They are all in joint possession in suit properties.
- Smt. Swati Goyal, the plaintiff claims that she is entitled to 1/5th share in the suit property
 and wants possession over the share and profits to the extent of 1/5th share from the income
 of the said family property.
- 3. The defendants filed a written statement contesting the claim of the plaintiff. They admit the relationship and the death of their father leaving behind the legal heirs as mentioned in the plaint. But denied the allegation that the suit properties exclusively belong to late Shri. Sudhir Guputa and also denied the joint possession.
- 4. The suit properties belong to Hindu Undivided family of which late Shri. Sudhir Gupta was the karta and the coparcener and the two sons are the other two coparceners according to claim of the defendants in their written statements. The schedule properties are ancestral properties which were received by the way of family partition evidenced by a registered deed

of partition dated 29.3.1967 by and between late Shri Sudhir Gupta and his brothers. Shri Sudhir Gupta received the schedule properties towards his branch of the Hindu Undivided family. After Shri Sudhir Gupta died intestate, his legal heirs i.e. the plaintiff and the defendants have succeeded to his 1/3rd share in the suit properties and the other 2/3rd share in the schedule properties belong to the two sons, Shri Subodh Gupta and Shri Shreyas Gupta, the coparceners.

- 5. Presently, the possession of the schedule properties is with Shri Subodh Gupta, the eldest in the family. Therefore, they deny the claim of the plaintiff to be entitled to 1/5th share in the joint family properties but are ready to give the plaintiff the 1/20th share to which she is entitled to in law.
- 6. The trial court in view of the oral and documentary evidence on record held that there was partition between Shri Sudhir Gupta and his brothers on 29.3.1967 in which partition, the suit properties fell to the share of the late Shri Sudhir Gupta and all the suit properties are ancestral properties/coparcenary properties.
- 7. Further the trial court held that in view of section 6 of the Hindu Succession act, Shri Sudhir Gupta would have got 1/4th share on partition between him, his wife and two sons and that 1/4th share of Sudhir Gupta would devolve on all the legal representatives equally and thus the plaintiff is entitled to 1/5th share in the 1/4th share of her father and not 1/5th share as claimed by the plaintiff. Therefore, it decreed the suit of the plaintiff granting her 1/20th share in the schedule properties as well as the share in the income. Thus it decreed the suit of the plaintiff partly.
- Aggrieved by the said judgment and decree of the Trial Court, the plaintiff is in the appeal.
 The said judgment was rendered on 17th January 2004. The Hindu Succession Act came to be

amended by the parliament by the Hindu Succession Act 2005(Act 39 of 2005) which came into force on 9th September, 2005. By the aforesaid amendment act, Section 6 of the principal act was substituted by new section 6, providing for devolution of interest in coparcenary property to a daughter coparcener.

- 9. The Hon'ble High Court admitted the appeal and held that since partition has neither been affected by a registered deed or by the decree of the court, therefore the plaintiff has been conferred the status of the coparcener by birth and conferred same rights in the coparcenary properties as she would have had if she had been a son since amended Section 6 operates retrospectively.
- 10. In view of its reasoning, the High Court gave a final order setting aside the judgment and decree of the trial court and also declared the plaintiff to be entitled to 6/25th share in the schedule properties as well as for mesne profits.

At last the event was ended with the vote of thanks by Dr. Aparna Soti.



Mr. Abhishek Atrey sir addressed the students and told them the importance of the environment and advised all of them to save it.


With this there was a case analysis competition also organised in which the students presented different landmark judgements in their views.

REPORT ON LEGAL AID CAMP AT DUJANA

These are those people who are not capable to afford a legal representative for them who can fight a case for them. 





Report of National Lok Adalat at District Court, Noida

Date: 23rd Apr. 2018

Date : 22nd April, 2018

Timings: 10.30. A.M. Onwards
Venue: District Court, Noida.

In recent times, the need for Alternate Dispute Resolution System, like the Arbitration, Mediation, Conciliation etc has taken up unprecedented significance, especially in light of the huge number of litigations pending in the Indian Courts. The Institution of Lok Adalats have come to the fore as one of such devices which not only help save time of the litigants but is also cost effective and reduces the workload of already burdened Courts. Students not only need the conceptual knowledge about the Law subjects but also practical exposure in this field.

Towards this end, the IPEM Law Academy organized a visit to The National Lok Adalat held at the District Court Noida on 22nd April 2018 at 10.30 AM, for LL.B VI & B.A.LL.B. X Sem students. About 35 Students had attended this National Lok Adalat and witnessed the proceedings taking place there.

The Activity Coordinators had briefed the Students about the Background of the Lok Adalats and its constitution & functioning under the Legal Services Authorities Act. Further, they were also apprised that once a decision is reached between the Parties in the Lok Adal t, it is final and binding and cannot be challenged. In the event, that the parties fail to arrive at a compromise, the case is taken up in the usual manner in court and thereafter, decided on merit. The Coordinators had thereafter, asked the students to form groups of 6-7 and were then advised to approach the various benches of Judges who were disposing of the matters in the Lok Adalat to observe the proceedings. They were asked to note down their brief facts and the terms of Compromise, if any reached therein. They were also asked to interview the Litigants to get first hand information. The students were directed to politely inquire from the parties directly about their cases or matters being disposed of. The students were however cautioned to act discreetly and with sensitiveness when collecting information in matrimonial matters or Motor Accident Claims.

They were also briefed about the types of the cases that can be dealt with at the Lok Adalat. They cover, civil matters, criminal cases of petty nature and, such matters which are disposed of with imposition of fines.

Types of Cases disposed of in the National Lok Adalat & witnessed by the students

1. Matrimonial Dispute Cases:

The students were able to witness matrimonial matters pertaining to the claim of Maintenance by the wife and decree of Divorce in the Family Court. The Presiding officer



was seen directly interacting with the aggrieved wife, sidelining the Advocate to ensure that no undue influence has been exercised upon her.

2. Bank Loan Recovery Matters

These matters formed the majority of the cases being decided there. Representatives of Several banks (Syndicate bank, SBI, Bank of Patiala, Punjab National Bank etc) were also present in bank Loan recovery cases put up for disposal there. Most of the parties had the grievance of how the claimed amount far exceeded the principal amount due to high rate of interest. In one of the matters the Bank had not issued a NOC to the borrower party despite the payment having been made under the order of Lok Adalat.

3. Motor Accident Claim Matters

Several matters pertaining to the claims made in Accidents under the Motors Vehicle Act were also observed by the students at the Lok Adalat. In few cases it was seen that despite issuance of several summons by the Tribunal, the Insurance Companies had failed to make an appearance in these cases. In two cases of fatalities, the legal heirs/representatives (Wife & Mother of the deceased victim) were prosecuting the matter. Such delicate matters were asked by the students to be dealt with sensitively while gathering information.

4. Miscellaneous Matters

Apart from the above mentioned cases, other matters such as Drinking/Consuming Alcohol in the Public Place & creating Nuisance, Gambling, seeking Compensation in acquisition of land at Hapur at revised rate From NHAI, Illegal sale of the Land in contravention of the High Court Order/Notification, Succession Claims by legal Heirs of the deceased, Challan in Violation of Traffic Rules, were also put up in the cause list for disposal at the Lok Adalat.

The students had visited the District Judge Court, Additional District Judges Court, Civil Judge Senior & Junior Division Court, Family Court, Chief Judicial Magistrate Court, Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate Courts to get the hands on experience.

Address By Ms. Neelu Mainwal ADJ (Senior Devision)

Upon the final leg of the visit, the Activity Coordinators were also able to request ADJ, Smt. Neelu Mainwal to address our students, which he graciously agreed to. She gave a brief account of the origin of Lok Adalat as provided under the Legal Service Authority Act and the various provisions under the Civil Procedure Code & Criminal Procedure Code where the parties could settle their cases through the Lok Adalat. She further, elaborated the cases which could be made subject matter of the Lok Adalat, viz. civil matter, cases of compoundable nature, petty matters, summary trial cases. She had further elaborated upon the types of cases that he had dealt with in the Lok Adalat, viz. Theft of Electricity, Non-Payment of Electricity bills, objections to the Final Report submitted by the Investigating officers, Motor Accident Claims, etc. She had also satisfactorily entertained the queries of the Students regarding other cases also.

Thereafter, the students had taken a break for refreshment at the Court canteen. The Faculty members had profusely thanked ADJ Ms. Neelu Mainwal in securing the permission from DLSA, Noida, for our students to attend the Lok Adalat and coordinating the visit. The students had been asked to prepare a Report upon this National Lok Adalat to be recorded in their Project File. The students had had an educative and an informative visit.





ORIENTATION PROGRAMME



As a result, this area requires each of us to engage in discussions, debates, and information dissemination. In accordance with these basic expectations, IPEM Law Academy organized a workshop on "Right to Privacy" on October 23rd, 2018.

OBJECTIVES OF THE WORKSHOP

- > To identify and clarify the principles of right to privacy.
- > To trace the judicial development of right to privacy as a fundamental right.
- To address standards and best practices in the promotion and protection of the right to privacy in the digital age.
- > To engage the students in a discussion/debate over the Privacy Judgement.

DETAILED REPORT OF THE WORKSHOP

IPEM Law Academy organized a workshop on "Right to Privacy" on 23rd October 2018 at G1 Hall, IPEM, Ghaziabad.

The workshop was attended by a total of 25 participants including various academicians, faculty members of the institute and students.

The workshop began with an introduction on the theme of the workshop by Mr. Himanshu who discussed the objectives of the workshop. It was followed by the welcome address by our Principal, Dr. R. P. Upadhyay.

The workshop was conducted by our esteemed Alumni Mr. Arun Kumar & Mr. Vibhav Saxena. They addressed the students and faculties with utmost respect and conviction. The workshop started with a discussion on the essence of the Constitution in nexus with the judgement of Justice K. S. Puttaswamy v. Union of India. Further, Mr. Arun Kumar explained the Supreme Court's unequivocal and unanimous affirmation of the right to privacy, the government's declared commitment to a data protection law, and the founding of the Sri Krishna Committee as developments that will continue to impact India's privacy policymaking for a long time. Moreover, he also discussed that the Supreme Court's definition of a robust right to privacy includes geographical, decisional, and informational elements. It was further elaborated that the influence of this verdict and a data protection law on informational privacy in India would be enormous, thus it's critical to look into the obstacles and issues that may arise.

Mr. Vibha Saxena underlined the vulnerabilities of data accumulation. Banks, for example, acquire data but delegate processing to third parties. In this scenario, the norms must be defined. The subject must be notified why the data is being collected at the time of transaction, and express agreement must be obtained every time personal sensitive data is utilized. At any point, the relevant authority should be able to withdraw his permission. Currently, data in this country is not secure, and it should be ensured that only relevant, accurate and up-to-date data is collected. Every time data is collected, the regulator must be informed.

The speakers engaged the participants in a discussion and made a total of 9 teams for a debate on the Privacy Judgment. The entire session was judged by Mr. Arun Kumar & Mr Vibhav Saxena, followed by felicitation of the winners.

The workshop also touched upon various international standards and best practices in the promotion and protection of right to privacy in the digital age and how it can be incorporated in our country through various policies.

In the end, Ms. Madhuri Gupta gave a vote of thanks to the speakers and the participants who took out time to attend the session

Report of Legal Aid Camp on 18.8.2018

And in my own life, in my own small way, I've tried to give back to this country that has given me so much. That's why I left a job at a law firm for a career in public service, working to empower young people to volunteer in their communities. Because I believe that each of us — no matter what our age or background or walk of life — each of us has something to contribute to the life of this nation.—Michelle Obama

Legal Aid Clinics basically serve the purpose of providing legal advice not for the aim of earning profit but in General Public Interest. In law schools, though knowledge of law is thoroughly imparted. However theoretical knowledge is not sufficient when its applicability is not known. Opportunities for mooting are also limited. Students pursuing law have zeal and enthusiasm to provide legal services. Legal aid clinics thus serve the two-fold purpose, the first that they provide free legal services to economically weaker people and second, they direct the energies of the students of law in contributing to the society. These students are headed by their teachers. The members of the Legal Aid clinic are engaged in spreading legal awareness in rural areas through street plays as well as legal aid camps where they make the target population aware of different legal service programs and guide them to avail these facilities.

Article 14 of the Constitution of India talks about equality before law and Article 39A provides for equal justice and free legal aid.

"Article 39A of the Constitution of India provides for holistic approach in imparting justice to the litigating parties. It not only includes providing free legal aid via appointment of counsel for the litigants, but also includes ensuring that justice is not denied to litigating parties due to financial difficulties."

"The State, which has been mandated by Article 39A of the Constitution to ensure that the operation of the legal system promotes justice by providing free legal aid and that opportunities for securing justice are not denied to any citizen by reason of economic or other disabilities, has

not been able to create an effective mechanism for making justice accessible to the poor, downtrodden and disadvantaged. In last two and a half decades the institution of the legal services authorities has rendered yeoman's service in the field of providing legal aid to the poor but a lot is required to be done for ensuring justice to economically deprived section of the society and those who suffer from other disabilities like illiteracy and ignorance

Keeping in view of the above stated objectives IPEM Law Academy has organized Legal Aid Camp, Domestic Violence against Women at Sector -4 Raj Nagar, Ghaziabad on 18th August, 2018. Faculty and students have participated in the legal aid camp by expressing their thoughts and views on the above-stated issues. The Camp was started with tribute to Late Atal Bihari Vajpayee (Former Prime Minister) by Ms. Sheela along with Faculty Members and Students for Five Minutes. The Introduction and importance of Legal Aid Camp was done by Dr. Meenakshi Tomar(Assistant Professor) which help to solve the problems of weaker sections of the society which are helpless in getting justice from the Courts, followed by Mr. Sudhakaran (Asst. Professor) who gave the throughout structure of the legal provisions in the Constitution and different Laws for the welfare and protection of Women Rights. 




LEGAL AID CAMP




He told the advantages of mooting are as follows:
